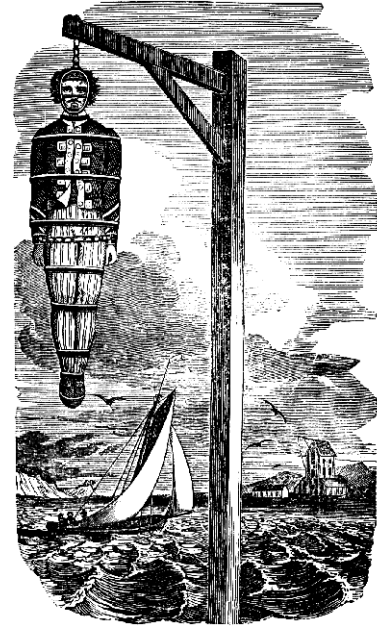

Tivvy Boys take a pasting

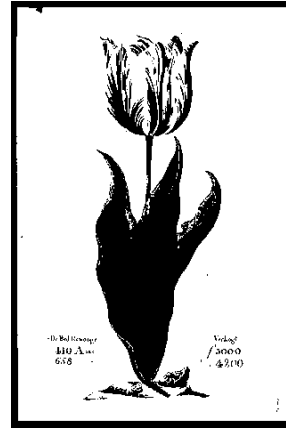
